<u>Presentation: Care Net Pregnancy Center of Penn Yan</u> Ria Lepp

- New program: Forward Thinking for sexual risk avoidance
- Includes general health promotion as well as mental and emotional health, and guidance for healthy relationships and avoiding abuse
- Long term support group for grades 4-12 and the adult population, all classes are age appropriate
- Program lasts 10 weeks, classes are 1 hour long
- Available at the center, and will hopefully be in schools soon

<u>Presentation: Healthy Family of Ontario and Yates</u> Sarah Scorsone, Teresa Deacon, Colleen Scott

- New program through Child and Family Resources as of January 2017
- Office locations: Geneva, Canandaigua, Penn Yan, Seneca Falls
- Program is free and voluntary, and not income based. No financial questions are asked.
- Referrals can be made as soon as a woman finds out she is pregnant and up until a baby is 92 days old. Anything after that is not accepted due to routines already being in place and hard to change. The sooner the better, preferably prenatally.
- Program is broken down into two parts:
 - o First: One-time assessment to look at challenges and needs. Can be broken into parts, and done at a location outside of the home.
 - Second: Long Term Home visiting service for 5 years. Goals are established (finding different housing, getting a driver's license, or even finishing all the laundry by Friday night), and plans are all individualized.
 - Prenatal visits are every other week, birth to age 3 is every week, and age 3-5 can be quarterly (minimum)
- Requires Ages and Stages Questionnaire and tracks child development
- Professionals are mandated reporters, and two are bilingual
- There is also a Spanish referral form.
- Program cannot provide transportation or funding for services; but equipped to connect and refer to services that can
- If a child is placed with a family member or in foster care, services can still continue
