## **Presentation: Finger Lakes Community Health**

### **TeleHealth and TeleDental - Gabrielle Wheeler, Casey Castner, Colleen Runner**

- *Please see attached power point presentation for information*
- TeleHealth is a new concept that Finger Lakes Community Health locations is using to bridge gaps and barriers to services and care in rural areas (including care for Mennonites and those who do not speak English)

- Patients can use their preferred FLCH provider location to access services using many technological peripherals depending on the type of visit
- Takes less time away from work, costs less in terms of travel, less stress of navigating Rochester, Syracuse, etc. to see a specialist
- Translators are available on site or through Language Line
- Eliminates having to re-address barriers to care in a new setting when they have already been established in e FLCH location, as well as provider/patient trust in those locations
- Embraces cultural awareness with poverty, migrant lifestyles, rural culture, etc.
- Has been proven to improve access, outcomes, and utilization
- FLCH uses its own server for this service that is secure and HIPPA compliant
- Visit is billed by specialist to patient/insurance
- Patients do need to be patients of a FLCH location to use this service, they are currently accepting patients

### **Maternal and Infant Health Program – Jennifer Hurlburt**

- Very new program, brochures to come soon.
- Jennifer works out of the Newark office as a prenatal case worker
- Program helps prenatal mothers overcome barriers including insurance, costs, and services coordination
- There will be translators available as well as language line
- Goal is to increase rates of prenatal care in the first trimester, ensure at least 5 well child visits before 15 months, and lead testing and immunizations by age 2, while decreasing rates of low birth weights (average of 5lbs)
- Program will work closely with Healthy Families and looking to partner with other local programs/agencies
- Enrollment needs to be done prenatally, and program lasts until age 2
