Agency Presentation: Pet Partner Connections

The difference between a Service Animal and a Support Animal.

- A service animal is covered under the Americans with Disability Act, they are by definition a dog that is trained to assist an individual with a disability. Service dogs are trained to do almost any task that they can specifically use to assist their handler. Not all Disabilities an individual has may be visible. By law service animals are permitted to go anywhere that their handler goes. There are only two questions business owners are permitted to ask:
Is this a service animal?
What task is the animal trained to do?
Anyone can claim their dog as a service animal as there is no data base recognized by the government that tracks service animals and their certification.
- A support animal is not covered under the Americans Disability Act however they are covered under the Fair housing Act. Service animals can not be discriminated against however landlords are not required to make unreasonable accommodations for a service animal. Landlords are permitted to request a statement from a physician and or Mental Health provider support this claim. Unlike Service animals a support animal is not permitted to go anywhere that humans go.
