Infant and Toddler Services

New York State has established an Infant and Toddler Technical Assistance Network that provides support services provided throughout the state. Steuben and Schuyler Counties are part of the Office of Children and Family Services, Region II Network. The network utilizes the Theory of Change Outcome Based Model which includes a multi-level of services that enhance and support high quality care for infants and toddlers. The Region II Theory of Change Model is based on the Ten Components of Quality Infant Toddler Care which is anchored in evidence-based practices and scientific research.
